



Caesar one of many reasons we should celebrate K9 Veterans Day

Every Year on March 13, a National Veterans Holiday is observed by a small percentage of Americans who are aware of it. It is a day to remember "man's best friend" and the amazing service they have provided to the U.S. military, officially since 1942, when the Dogs for Defense Program

Dogs were donated by breeders, families and even Hollywood stars. One dog. a German Shepherd named Caesar, was the first to be wounded in combat in WWII, saving his fellow Marines numerous times on the Island of Bougainville, far away from the streets of the Bronx, where he was raised and loved by three brothers who spent a lot of time training him with basic commands and to do tricks.

Max, Morris and Irving Glazer each pitched in \$20 to buy the German Shepherd from a breeder on Long Island. Caesar was so well trained and intelligent that the boys would buy meat from the butcher and he would carry the package back home to the boys' mother - 15 blocks away without devouring it or even putting a tooth mark in the paper.

By 1942, all three boys had joined up and left home to fight and serve their country. Heartbroken and Caesar lonely, depressed and lethargic. Mrs. Glazer heard about a new military program for dogs and decided that it would be a good fit for Caesar, so she enrolled him for service.

Caesar went to Camp Lejeune, N.C., and like any Devil Dog, went through boot camp. He graduated and was sent to Camp Pendleton, Calif., for 13 more weeks of advanced training, and was given to two Marine dog handlers in the 1st War Dog Platoon, Company M of the 3rd Marine Raider Battalion.

PFC Rufus Mayo, an Alabama resident who had raised hunting dogs, and PFC Johnny Kleeman, a 17year-old from Philadelphia, bonded and worked with

Marine Raiders were a new, special forces unit of their day in the Corps.

Dogs and men huddled aboard three Higgins landing craft on the morning of Nov. 1, 1943. Mortar shells rained down on them, almost capsizing one of the boats. They rushed onto the beach, dodging enemy fire on the way to the tree line.

Thousands of landing boats had ferried 14,000 Allied troops and 6,200 tons of equipment from U.S. Navy attack transports toward the bay at sunrise that morning, surprising the 45,000 Japanese troops dug into the foothills Bougainville Island.

Between Papua New Guinea and the Solomon Islands, lies Bougainville full of inlet waterways, swamps and can't-see-yourhand-in-front-of-you jungle. One Marine interviewed said, "If there is a Hell, it looks just like Bougainville." Hell seems just where Marines like to

however, before the Japanese organized a counterattack. The American forces confronted the notorious 6th Division of

Imperial Japanese Army

infantrymen, led by Lt.

Gen. Masatane Kanda.

In the Second Sino-Japanese War, Kanda participated in the Rape of Nanking, where Japanese soldiers murdered up to 300,000 Chinese civilians. On top of this, jungle fighting was still a new proposition for the U.S. Marines.

Mere hours after landing, Andy the scout dog, a Doberman and Caesar the messenger dog were called up for their first major assignment heading up the Piva Trail. Both K9s alerted to a Japanese machine gun nest and a sniper, saving dozens of American lives.

M Company advanced further into the island than any other American patrol that day and with no casualties, thanks to Andy and Caesar. That night, PFC Mayo heard Caesar spring up. In the dark, Mayo saw a black grenade laying at their feet. Adrenaline flooded his body. On instinct, he tossed it back outside and braced for the blow. After the explosion he lay still, It wouldn't be long, the other men were quiet, then the chirping, croaking sounds of nocturnal creatures soon resumed. Mayo was afraid but having

Caesar with him in that hole

gave him comfort. Caesar

was Mayo's only sense of

safety. Mayo pet Caesar and fell asleep until dawn when he awoke, still tired.

In the morning light, the Marines found eight more dead Japanese soldiers where Mayo had tossed the grenade. The next day was spent attempting to string up phone lines, which the Japanese cut just as fast as they were put up. Night fell.

The next morning Caesar growled ferociously, scaring Mayo awake at dawn. No grenade this time. Mayo saw Caesar leaping out of the foxhole and running after something. The private saw that Japanese soldiers had infiltrated the camp. Caesar went on the attack to protect Mayo.

Two Japanese soldiers were emerging from a stand of trees toward the foxhole and Caesar had gone out to intercept them. Mayo called for his battle buddy and then watched the dog skitter sideways and fall. In the confusion, with Japanese soldiers overrunning the camp and Americans leaping out of foxholes to fight them off, Mayo lost track of Caesar.

After the gunfire ceased, he found a trail of blood leading into the jungle. He found Caesar, bleeding out in the bushes just outside the battalion command post with PFC Kleeman and barely conscious.

Three marines hacked down two lengths of bamboo and fastened dungarees between them to make a mobile hammock. A dozen Marines volunteered to carry Caesar's stretcher. A procession took Caesar, flanked by Mayo and Kleeman, to the first-aid station. The two dog handlers waited anxiously while the surgeon operated.

In March 1945, Dogs for Defense stopped recruiting dogs for the military, turning that responsibility over to the Defense Department. Caesar had already completed eight communication runs, and despite his wounds, finished his ninth, after which he received medical treatment. received an official commendation for his work (given both to him and his handlers, as well as a note sent to his previous owners), was promoted to corporal and eventually returned to service.

After the war, an outcry ended plans to euthanize the remaining veteran animals, and instead they were put through demilitarization training with almost universal success. One thousand seventy-

four dogs served in the Marine Corps in WWII, of which 559 survived. Many were returned to their families, although in more than a few cases, the Marine handler would bring the dog back to civilian life with




